Officer & Staff Reports

- President Discussed the Carolina Cup Budget and having a World Cup Viewing Party at the Carolina Cup. Stated the Board Meetings will be remote for the rest of the year. We will be receiving a Waiver of Liability update from Paul James later in the meeting. The USASA Champions of Regions tournament is August 19-21st. NC will have 2 teams in the Over 40 division- Wanderers and Sporting Charlotte. Charlotte Eagles will represent NC in the Women's-Amateur division. Tobacco Road had to back out, so the Goldsboro Strike Eagles has taken that spot in the Men's Open division.
- Executive Director Completed work for the Queen City Cup and continuing to work on Beer City. The Insurance Claims have slowed down and also the D & A has slowed down also. Preparing teams for the Champions of Regions. US Soccer has been doing marketing kits for World Cup viewing parties. Attended a workshop and they discussed International Travel Clearance which involves the travel of players outside of the country. Attended the USASA National Club tournament and Milwaukee Bavarians beat Nova FC (Virginia) in the final 1-0.
- Vice President Working on registration issues and that she is on the US Adult Soccer Budget Committee.
- Treasurer State is doing well financially, and this past month saw a number of single event registrations from Queen City Cup and Beer City Cup. There are a handful of League Affiliation Fees that have not been paid. There is also a Commission Host fee that needs to be paid to host a tournament

Growth Initiative

- Registration Report
 - Donna Langdon stated we have passed league player registrations for 2021. There are currently 8606 registered players. PASL, TASL and Wilmington have passed their 2021 registrations.
 - Tournament only passes are increasing, and a lot of people are purchasing the annual passes instead of the tournament only passes.

- First Year Leagues Update The OCASL League finished their summer season and is starting the fall season this week.
- New League Update Alex stated the potential Brevard league is looking at hosting a tournament to help gauge interest.

Competitions

- Champions of Regions Scott will be in attendance for the Champions of Region. He stated that all teams have been rostered correctly and confident that the teams from NC will do well.
- Carolinas Cup- Continuing to work on the World Cup Viewing Party. Working on chairs, tables, etc. for the Viewing Party. Field 15 will be in play for the tournament. The budget for the tournament will be presented tonight. Discussing bringing back Performance Bonds due to 3 teams skipping their final game last year. Discussions are in process as to whether using checks or credit cards for the Performance Bond are the best option. The website will be open for registration on September 1st. Working with apparel company for more and wider variety of merchandise to sell. Goal is 78 teams and all on 1 complex.
- Celebrate the Tatas Alex is continuing to work on items for the Celebrate the Tatas tournament. The tournament is getting a lot of financial support from sponsors/donors. There are email commitments from teams but need those teams to actually register. Possibly a Roanoke and a Georgia team participating this year.
- Queen City Cup- There were 23 teams and 21 were from NC.
- Beer City Cup- Affinity had some upgrades and that caused an issue with the registration process. There are extra steps to the team registration when a tournament only pass is purchased. Those players are added to a bucket, and they have to be added to the teams manually. Cindy has done a tremendous amount of work for the Beer City registration process. The process is much easier now than in the past for the Friday before the tournament due to player cards do not need to be distributed. The rosters contain all of that information including player pictures. There are 82 out-of-state teams and 35 NC teams.

Referee Registration Update

US Soccer added more extensive Waiver of Liability and Promotional Likeness Waiver to the items referees must agree to as part of the registration process. The State Referee Administrator thinks these new provisions are problematic (and referees will choose not to register), although there is a possibility that these waivers will not be enforceable in NC. 2023 registration has opened, but NC referees are being warned (via pop up) that they should review these waivers before signing them. This is still an ongoing concern, and Paul James has been working on it.

• Carolinas Cup Budget- NCASA annual budget assumed a 50-team tournament with equal revenues and expenses (as a placeholder). The Carolinas Cup committee has set a goal of 78 teams for 2022. Based on a budget for 78 teams, the committee expects the tournament to be \$2000 in the red, although the committee is looking at ways to eliminate this deficit. In 2021, the tournament made money, in part due to a decision to increase registration fees. Due to inflation, prices of several items have increased, most notably referee fees and related costs, but also

items such as trophies. There is an increase of \$1400 for the fields, \$5000 increase in ref fees, and an increase for lodging accommodations for refs. All of the inventory for the tournament was sold in 2021, so will need gifts for the captains and championship shirts. The committee did not want to increase registration fees two consecutive years, so it was thought that it was appropriate to ask the Board to approve a budget with a small deficit. The Carolinas Cup budget was approved unanimously for the 2022 tournament. (Text of motion is included below.)

Additional New Business (motions - 2/3 vote required for consideration)

• Tobacco Road is not able to participate in the Champions of Regions and their place is being taken by Goldsboro Strike Eagles. The motion passed for the \$1000 that was originally going to Tobacco Rd to be transferred to Goldsboro Strike Eagles. (Text of motion is included below.)

Canopies, sent over three mockups, the first being simply our current canopy top, the next is a

canopy is the banner on our logo will be trimmed in white, it just is not reflected in the mockup.)
Board members shared their opinions on the canopy options, and the red canopy was the clear
favorite based on the straw poll taken of the Board. Darius will order the canopies, and he hopes
that they will be available for use at Beer City Cup.

Carolinas Cap Budget

Whereas the Board approved a policy at its February 21, 2022, meeting requiring the Carolinas Cup committee to present to the Board for approval a proposed budget describing how funds already budgeted in the annual budget for the Carolinas Cup are expected to be spent no later than three months before the start date of the Carolinas Cup tournament.

Whereas the Budgetary Spending Authority Policy allows the Carolinas Cup committee to expend funds beyond the budgeted funds up to the amount of revenues from the event, and

Whereas the August 15, 2022, NCASA Board meeting is the final Board meeting occurring more than three months before the start date of the Carolinas Cup tournament,

Be it resolved that the Board authorizes the Carolinas Cup committee to spend \$66,000, consisting of the already budgeted funds of \$37,500 plus an additional \$28,500, with the additional spending primarily paid for by additional revenues from the event (e.g., additional registration fees, sponsorships, and donations, including in-kind donations), in a manner consistent with the following proposed budget:

Modification to Previously Approved Championship of Regions Team Travel Subsidy

Whereas, at its July 18, 2022, Board meeting, the NCASA Board approved the spending of up to \$4,000 to help cover travel expenses for four NCASA teams competing at the Championship of Regions, and

Whereas, one of the identified NCASA teams (Tobacco Road) is no longer able to compete at the Championship of Regions and another NCASA team (Goldsboro Strike Eagles) has been selected to compete at the Championship of Regions in their place,

Be it resolved that the \$4,000 appropriation approved for the Championship of Regions Team Travel Subsidy will be divided between the following four teams:

- Goldsboro Strike Eagles \$1,000
- Charlotte Eagles \$1,000
- Sporting Charlotte \$1,000
- Wanderers FC \$1,000
