Officer & Staff Reports

 President – Welcome everyone, we have light attendance tonight with only one main item for consideration. We will be seeking approval of the 2023 Carolinas Cup Budget.

Registration is strong. NCASA has surpassed our registration numbers in both our annual passes and tournament only passes. This is a testament to all the hard work at the local levels, providing excellent programs and playing opportunities.

- Executive Director In August, we completed the last of the D&A cases on the docket. Worked
 on the Carolinas Cup budget, acquiring accurate costs and examining where we can cut costs.
 The resurrection of the First Flight has also been a focus. Beer City Cup and Queen City Cup
 rostering has taken a lot of attention. NCASA attended the Queen City Cup with all of our gear
 to support. It was our first time at the Matthews Sportsplex and the tournament was well run and
 a lot of fun was had by all. Next stop, Beer City Cup.
- Sam and I met with a tournament organizer to discuss possible affiliation. I also held a zoom call
 with a Facebook Pick Up league in Winston-Salem. They have over 900 members. They are
 also interested in affiliation but it is very different from a league or tournament so we are exploring
 what this relationship may look like. We have worked to get Wake Women Soccer League open
 for registration
- Executive Vice President not present
- Treasurer Circulated the P&L statements January through July Budget vs Actuals. NCASA is currently \$88,000 above budget. The treasurer's report was submitted showing investment interest earned. The treasurer has implemented a new format, separating tournaments from the general budget. NCASA is in a strong financial position.

Growth Initiative

- Registration Report As noted in the President's opening remarks, our numbers look great. and
 many of our leagues have just begun to open Fall registration, so our numbers will continue to
 grow.
- First Year Leagues Update Wake Women's Soccer League has opened registration. They have a certified referee assignor, secured fields, applied for COI and are registering players.
- New League Update Sam Cohen and Darius Ejlali met with a tournament organizer Francis
 Nyeekpee about affiliating. Darius Ejlali held a conference call with a Winston-Salem pick up of about
 900 members. Working on a creative approach to membership given the uniqueness of this
 organization.

Competitions

- Carolinas Cup Progress has been good, budget submitted, trophies ordered, trainers secured, fields in place and opening registration up September 1st. NCASA has fallen behind on social media announcements. A very busy summer has contributed to not releasing Save the Date announcements. With so many events, communication blasts have not slowed down and striking the balance of too much information hitting membership is a concern. With announcements of USASA Adult Soccer Fest, Save the Date for Tatas, Queen City Cup and Beer City Cup, saturation of information became real.
- Celebrate the Tatas Teams are registering, hotels in place and the Saturday night party location have been picked. Location of fields, hotel and brewery are all in close proximity. Donations continue to be strong.
- 2023 USASA Adult Soccer Fest USASA has stated that the event will return in 2024.
- 2023 Queen City Cup This year's QCC was smaller than past years, but the event brought in more quality teams and the event hit new strides with atmosphere and positive feedback, laying the groundwork for next year's QCC to build upon the successes of 2023. NCASA had a presence which was appreciated by teams, players, and organizers.

2023 Beer City Cup – 130 teams have registered. NCASA is managing the rostering well. The process is labor intensive due to needing to properly verify out of state registrations but also ensure that proper documents with date of birth are submitted and accurate. There are cash purses awarded to Champions and in Savannah there was a Champion crowned that used underage players. This type of cheating must stop, not only for the obvious reason but it hurts the integrity of the event. NCASA and Beer City Cup have put in place efforts to minimize the ability to use underage players. Guest, David Turner from Home Team Soccer Tournaments was invited into the discussion.

Carolinas Cap Budget

Whereas the Board approved a policy at its February 21, 2022, meeting requiring the Carolinas Cup committee to present to the Board for approval a proposed budget describing how funds already budgeted in the annual budget for the Carolinas Cup are expected to be spent no later than three months before the start date of the Carolinas Cup tournament;

Whereas the Budgetary Spending Authority Policy allows the Carolinas Cup committee to expend funds beyond the budgeted funds up to the amount of revenues from the event, and Whereas the August 21, 2023, NCASA Board meeting is the final Board meeting occurring more than three months before the start date of the Carolinas Cup tournament, Be it resolved that the Board authorizes the Carolinas Cup committee to spend \$63,000, consisting of the already budgeted funds of \$45,000 plus an additional \$18,000, with the additional spending primarily paid for by additional revenues from the event (e.g., additional registration fees, sponsorships, and donations, including in-kind donations), in a manner consistent with the following proposed budget:
